Upon election, the Exco had to immediately work on the new ranking system which is still a work in progress. There was also the crucial procedure audit that FS had to align with Singapore Sport Council towards organisational excellence so ensure disbursement of funds.

In high performance we saw achievements in terms of medal haul from all fencers at the Southeast Asian as well as Asian levels. These will be mentioned in greater detail in the annual report.

What is noteworthy to mention is that our accounts are starting to be in the black since Financial Year 2011.

We look forward to working even closer with the community in the formation of a task force to move fencing to the next level. SECTION A : EXCELLANCE

(I) HIGH PERFORMANCE MANAGEMENT AND COACHING

a. Ranking System

A new ranking system was introduced in August 2013 and there was a new adjustment to the ranking year to align closely with Federation D'Esgrime. There was a townhall held on 19 September 2013 to receive feedbacks from the affiliates to fine-tune the ranking system.

b. High Performance Training and Competitions – Medals & Performance at Major Games (SNOC)

Asian Youth Games 2013 (16 to 24 August 2013)

This was the first time fencing is included in the Asian Youth Games which is in its second edition. A total of 11 athletes represent Singapore in this event. In our debut, Fencing Singapore achieved **3 bronze medals** in Men's Epee, Women's Sabre and Men's Sabre. The results are detailed in Annex A.

Asian Games 2014 (20 to 26 September 2014)

It is also noteworthy to mention that for the first time in Asian Games, Fencing Singapore will have 16 fencers representing Singapore.

c. High Performance Training and Competitions – Medals & Performance at Major Games

World Cadets and Juniors 2013 (April 2013)

A total of 23 athletes represented Singapore. Joshua Lim was **ranked 9th** in Men's Foil Individual Cadet Category. This is the highest achievement for a Singaporean. The results can be found in Annex A.

Asian Fencing Championships 2013 (June 2013)

Mission:To encourage, promote, develop and nurture fencing and fencers of all levels in Singapore. **Vision:** To make Singapore a world-class fencing nation by introducing the sport as a CCA to all schools, winning a medal at the 2014 Asian Games, and taking Singapore to the fencing event at the 2016 Olympic Games.

There were a total of 23 athletes who represented Singapore. In this competition, Singapore managed to achieve **3 Top 16s** (Men's Foil, Women's Foil and Women's Sabre) in individual events and **2 Top 8s** (Men's and Women's Foil) in team events. Please refer to Annex A for detailed results.

World Fencing Championships 2013 (August 2013)

19 Fencers represented Singapore in the World Fencing Championships 2013 and there were **4 Top 64s** qualification from Wang Wenying, David Chan, Lim Wei Wen and Tan Yuanzi. The results are detailed in Annex A.

South East Asia Fencing Federation 2014 (January 2014)

This is the first time SEAFF allowed 8 fencers per country to be represented. Singapore clearly made waves in the overall medal count by increasing the medal count to **52** in the latest edition.

e. National Competitions

Our local competitions were well supported by fencers from both affiliate clubs and schools. Between April 2013 to March 2014, we are highly encouraged that the highest jump (66%) in participation comes from the younger age groups as evident in Minime and National Inter-school. There was also a jump in the senior competitions (46%). This bore well for the future of Singapore that fencing is growing to be a more popular sport.

I SECRETARIAT HEADCOUNT

The financial year 2013 saw changes in the secretariat.

General Manager - Mr Edwin Ker joined Fencing Singapore in May 2013 and left to join Singapore Swimming Association in October 2013. Mr Lawrence Ng joined in late January 2014. (He unfortunately had to leave us in May 2014 due to personal reasons.)

Finance & Administrative Manager / Executive – Ms Grace Ong had to leave us after being in Fencing Singapore since April 2011 in October 2013. While we were sad to have her leave us, we were also happy to see her advance her career. Ms Grace Ong stayed on in a part-time basis and helped us trained Ms Chen Lay Hun from December 2013 to February 2014 when she joined Fencing Singapore in February 2014.

Marketing & Operations Executive – Ms Hadfizah left us in July 2013 and Cheryl Lim (as a part-timer) joined us full time. Talented in design, she could not continue so as to focus on her training as a fencer and left in October 2013. Ms Phua Hui Fen joined Fencing Singapore in January 2014. (She had to leave in July 2014 for her university studies.)

II COACHING HEADCOUNT

Fu Hao appointed National Epee Coach. As of 13 January 2013, Mr FU Hao from China has been appointed as Fencing Singapore's National Epee Coach and is in charge of all training matters for both National Men's and Women's Epee teams. As an athlete, he won numerous medals in the China national competitions. He started to pursue a degree in Sports in Dec 2001 from the Shenyang Sport University where he graduated in January 2005. From 2004, he was the head coach ay Liaoning Province. Following that, he was the National coach in Brunei before moving to Indonesia in June 2011 to coach the Indonesian team for SEA Games 2011 where Indonesia achieved 3 silvers in the individual women's epee, team men's epee and team women's epee under his tutelage.

Fencing Singapore also said its farewell to Dr Gabor Salamon, Technical Director of Fencing Singapore. Dr Gabor Salamon first joined Fencing Singapore in 2011. We had the opportunity to see him work with the fencing community for the past 2.5 years.
